

The Fifth Sunday of Easter April 28, 2024 at eleven o'clock in the morning



THE SEASON OF EASTER

The Fifty Days of Easter form a single festival period in which the tone of joy (created at the Easter Vigil) is sustained through the following seven weeks, and the Church celebrates the gloriously risen Christ.

The lit Easter Candle (also known as the Pascal Candle) stands prominently in church for all the Eastertide services. The Alleluia appears frequently in liturgical speech and song; white or gold vestments and decorations emphasize the joy and brightness of the season.

On the fortieth day of Easter, we celebrate Christ's ascension. He commissions his disciples to continue his work, he promises the gift of the Holy Spirit, and then he is no longer among them in the flesh. The arrival of the promised gift of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost completes and crowns the Easter Festival. *Liturgy Materials from* ChurchofEngland.org *The People stand*

OPENING COLLECT

PresiderThe Lord be with you.PeopleAnd also with you.

Presider Let us pray. Almighty God, whom truly to know is everlasting life: Grant us so perfectly to know your Son Jesus Christ to be the way, the truth, and the life, that we may steadfastly follow his steps in the way that leads to eternal life; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

The People are seated for the readings from Holy Scripture.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS, CHAPTER 8, BEGINNING VERSE 26

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter,

and like a lamb silent before its shearer,

so he does not open his mouth.

In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth."

The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

A READING FROM THE FIRST BOOK OF JOHN, CHAPTER 4 BEGINNING VERSE 7

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.


By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

THE GOSPEL

Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

THE SERMON

After a few moments for reflection and silence, the People are invited to stand (as they are able) for The Creed and Prayers.

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Presider The Holy Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, according to John.*People* Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit, he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Presider: With the light of Christ before us and the power of his resurrection behind us, let us now offer our prayers and intercessions to God's Holy and Risen Son.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, risen from death, we praise you for changed lives and new hope in this Easter Season. You came to Mary in the garden and turned her tears into joy. We pray that you would turn our nations and leaders away from wars and injustice toward the peace and joy of your kingdom.

For your love and mercy: We give you thanks, O Lord.

You came to the disciples in the upper room and turned their fear into courage. We pray for the whole Church, our deacons, priests, and bishops, and for this congregation here today. Turn our divisions and fear into strength and courage, that we might proclaim by word and example the good news to all people.

For your love and mercy: We give you thanks, O Lord.

You came to the disciples by the lakeside and turned their doubts into determination. We pray for our political leaders, our president, our congress, and judges, our governor, mayor, and local representatives. Transform their doubts into a deep determination, to make wise decisions and work for the common good.

For your love and mercy: We give you thanks, O Lord.

You came to the travelers on the Emmaus Road and turned their despair into hope. We pray for the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all fellow travelers on our spiritual path who have asked for our prayers, and those we name aloud or silently in our hearts that in your presence they may find strength. *[we pause in silence]*

For your love and mercy: We give you thanks, O Lord.

You come to us in our unworthiness and shame and turn our weakness into triumph. We pray for ourselves and our own needs. [we pause]. We also all who have died, including those including those we name either silently or aloud [we pause again], that our weakness in death will be turned into triumph, on the final day of resurrection in your heavenly kingdom.

For your love and mercy: We give you thanks, O Lord.

Presider: Lord Jesus, wherever we experience heartache, fear, or failure, despair, disappointment and doubt: Come to us today, and reveal your great love, your infinite mercy, and your risen power; for the glory of your name. **Alleluia and Amen.**



THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The People remain standing

Presider	The Lord be with you.
People	And also with you.
Presider	Lift up your hearts.
People	We lift them to the Lord.
Presider	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People	It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. [The presider adds a proper preface, stating why we offer our thanks and praise to God]. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of Power and Might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest.

After the Sanctus, the People stand or kneel. Then the Presider continues the Eucharistic Prayer:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Presider and People

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The Presider continues






